Dear Classic Motorcycle Enthusiast,

This year the Show is again being held in the **Rowallan Activity Centre near Fenwick**, on **Saturday 5th and Sunday 6th June**. The committee has decided to make the show a **two-day** event to celebrate its 21st Anniversary. The event is organised and run by members of the **Ayr Classic Motorcycle Club**, and is arguably the main old bike event in Scotland.

In the main "Classic" sections, only machines of over 15 years old - including Competition and Scooters - are eligible to enter. A separate "Custom" section has again been included this year. This section does not have an age limitation. There is also a section for unfinished, ongoing bike restorations.

Each exhibitor receives free entry to the show and, on arrival with their bike, will receive a specially produced fabric sew-on badge. It is well worth entering. Each class winner, as well as receiving a trophy and rosette, also receives a subscription to one of the monthly glossy magazines, i.e. Classic Motorcycle, Classic Bike Guide, Scootering International, or similar. The runners up get a subscription to Old Bike Mart.

All exhibitors can enter their machines to be there on both days or for the Sunday only, but it is my hope that most people will enter for both days, although the Sunday is the judged show day.

The Saturday will be a day of motorcycle attractions, and will include Stunt shows, Trials and Motocross displays, a parade of Classic racers, and a ride out for exhibitors around the local bye-ways (It isn't obligatory to participate in the ride out.)

We hope that the local Advanced Motorcycle Club will offer free Advanced Assessment runs on the day, and that a local Motorcycle Training School will offer short taster sessions on site.

The event also features a bike only auto-jumble, along with motorcycle retailers and charity stalls, and children's rides outside for the young at heart.

Free camping facilities are also available on for visitors who have traveled a long distance, and wish to stay overnight, and it is hoped to arrange a social event for the Saturday evening to make use of the excellent bar and restaurant.

A large proportion of the proceeds from admission charges are donated to a local charity. So come along and be part of the best bike show in Scotland, as without your bikes there will be no show. Please use the enclosed entry form, and feel free to copy it for a friend.
